Trust in Mainstream Media at a New Low, But the Black Press Stands as the Trusted Voice

Trust in America's mainstream media has fallen to its lowest level on record. Gallup reports that only 28 percent of adults say they have a great deal or fair amount of confidence in newspapers, television, and radio to report the news fully, accurately, and fairly. That is down from 31 percent last year and 40 percent five years ago. Seven in ten adults now say they have little or no confidence at all. Republicans show the deepest distrust, with only 8 percent expressing confidence in the media. Independents stand at 27 percent. Democrats, though still higher, have slipped to 51 percent, a figure that matches their previous low in 2016. Generational divides are also clear. Forty-three percent of adults aged 65 and

older trust the media, but no younger age group rises above 28 percent.

For Black America, this collapse of trust in mainstream outlets is not a new story. The Black Press has been the institution that carried the truth when no one else would. It published Frederick Douglass when white newspapers tried to silence him. It carried Ida B. Wells' anti-lynching reports when others dismissed them. It printed the images of Emmett Till when the mainstream turned away. It gave voice to Dr. King and Malcolm X when they were branded agitators. Now, as the mainstream loses credibility, the Black Press faces its own struggle to survive. Two years before its bicentennial, more than 200 family-owned Black

newspapers remain, many led by women. They battle economic starvation while carrying the weight of history. Corporate America has cut advertising. Washington has withdrawn support. Even as white billionaires like Mark Cuban have reached into their pockets, many of the wealthiest Black Americans have not stepped forward. Oprah Winfrey, Michael Jordan, Robert F. Smith, Jay-Z, Rihanna, LeBron James, Magic Johnson, Tyler Perry, and others together command nearly \$100 billion in wealth. Yet the institution that once defended its very humanity now fights to keep its doors open, as they've remained on the sidelines.

"Right now in America, we're under attack like we've never been in our lifetime,"

Ben Crump said at the Black Press' Annual National Leadership Awards in Washington. "So now more than ever, we have to make sure that we have institutions that are disseminating information to our people, being the clarion call for us to be ready to stand up for our children and our communities. And nobody carries the Black narrative and the Black information to Black communities more passionately than the Black Press." Crump pledged \$50,000 to support the Black Press, structured as \$10,000 a year over five years. "Everybody got to give a little more when they can. If you've been blessed, you got to pass the blessing on. You just can't keep it to yourself," Crump stated. "Because right now the Black Press is needed more



than ever before."

The institution he spoke of has never been an abstraction. In Tulsa in 1921, white mobs torched Black-owned newspapers to silence the truth. During Jim Crow, the Black Press guided families through terror and carried the voices of leaders who would shape the nation. Today, in a quieter but no less dangerous way, the Black Press is again under assault. It is being starved of the resources needed to survive,

while Black women publishers carry the dual burden of keeping their papers alive under policies that have driven their unemployment to historic highs. The Gallup survey shows how far the nation has fallen. "Confidence in the mass media is historically low," the authors wrote. "With fewer than three in ten Americans now placing trust in newspapers, television, and radio to report the news fully, fairly, and accurately."

Push yourself onward and upward. With your head held high and back straight, believe that you are valuable; believe that



AmeriStarRail Unveils Vision for a Reimagined Amtrak Experience

AmeriStarRail has outlined an ambitious proposal to partner with Amtrak to rebrand and expand its high-speed Acela service along the Northeast Corridor under the name “Libertyliner 250.” The Delaware-based company says the plan would introduce a triple-class system, modern amenities, and private financing to accelerate the rollout of the NextGen Acela fleet.

In a letter sent to Amtrak President Roger Harris, AmeriStarRail Chief Operating Officer Scott R. Spencer detailed how the Libertyliner 250 would “revolutionize” passenger rail service between Boston, New York, Philadelphia,

and Washington. Spencer said the company’s private sector investment could repay Amtrak’s \$2.4 billion federal loan for the new Acela trainsets while creating what he described as the most innovative rail passenger experience in the world. “The imaginative and innovative amenities of The Libertyliner 250 services are designed to provide a revolutionary way to travel on the Northeast Corridor,” Spencer wrote. “Although not the fastest trains in the world, AmeriStarRail’s vision is to operate Amtrak Libertyliner 250 trains with the greatest innovations to be the best rail passenger service in the world.”

Among the proposed features are a Family Coach

with free rides for children, an onboard play area, and a family restroom equipped with a toddler seat. All passengers would have access to free onboard entertainment, a café car lounge with a water bottle filling station, and reserved bike spaces for a fee. Business and First-Class riders would receive added perks, including cloth headrests, travel neck pillows, and free shoe shines in Amtrak stations. First Class passengers would enjoy an exclusive quiet section, massage chair pads at every seat, door-to-door baggage service, and both onboard and lounge-based massage options.

Spencer said the plan calls for standardizing Amtrak’s entire Northeast Cor-



ridor fleet to the Libertyliner 250 model, eliminating the need for slower trainsets and simplifying operations and maintenance. According to the letter, private financing would also allow all 28 trainsets to enter revenue service by May 2026, a year earlier than Amtrak’s current timeline, to meet the demand expect-

ed during America’s 250th anniversary celebrations and the 2026 FIFA World Cup. The proposal also includes new routes and service enhancements such as nonstop New York–Washington trips in under two hours and half-hour service intervals between major cities from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m. AmeriStarRail said its plan

is designed to make high-speed rail more affordable, providing access for families, students, seniors, and low-income travelers who currently cannot afford Acela fares. The company described the project as the most dramatic transformation of the Northeast Corridor since the introduction of the Metroliner in 1969.

Seven Straight Quarters of Crime Reduction: Safer Streets, Subways, and Communities

The Adams administration's North Star has always been public safety. New Yorkers want to be able to send their kids to school, go to work, shop in their local store, go out for dinner, and come home safely to their family and their community. They want to feel safe AND they want to be safe, and this administration has delivered that for them. Last week, we released the 2025 third quarter crime data for New York City, which shows that our public safety system is working.

From day one, we got to work sweeping out crime and illegal activities from our neighborhoods. Because of this work, we have finished our seventh consecutive quarter of crime reduc-

tion. That means for almost two straight years — since January 2024 — crime has consistently declined each quarter in New York City.

This new data shows that major crime for the third quarter was down 3.1 percent — equating to 1,048 fewer victims of major crime. That's more than 1,000 New Yorkers who did not fall victim to crime because we stayed focused on building a safer city. More specifically, six of the seven major crimes were also down for this quarter, including declines in homicides, robberies, felony assaults, burglaries, grand larcenies, and auto theft.

Our subways and public housing developments are also getting safer, with major crime down for the third quarter this year. Keeping New Yorkers safe is our number one commitment in this city, especially on the subway, which millions of riders rely on every day. And we continue to set records in our transit system — we had the safest summer in recorded history in our subways when you exclude the pandemic years, and we are going to continue to make sure New Yorkers can ride the train safely, day or night.

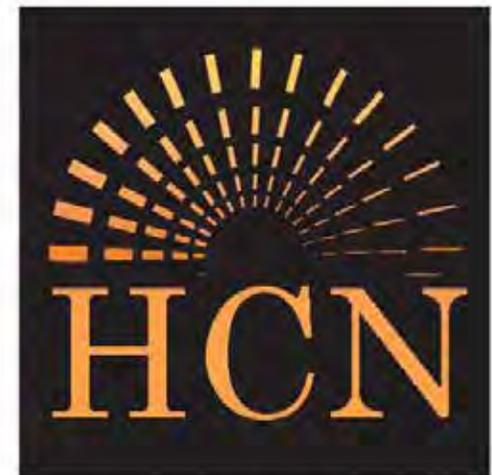
Additionally, shooting incidents were, once again, at record lows for the first nine months of the year, for the third quarter, and for the month of September. Shooting incidents were down nearly 30 percent for September, nearly 16 percent for the third quarter of 2025, and for the first nine months of the year, shooting victims were also at record lows — tying the previous record set in 2018. And when compared to the same period immediately before we came into office, shootings are down a staggering 54 percent.

Shooting victims were also down 32.5 percent for September and over 11 percent for the third quarter. Those are the dividends paid from the more than 4,100 illegal guns taken off the street this year alone, and the almost 24,000 guns removed since the start of our administration. That is 24,000 weapons that no longer threaten the safety of our neighborhoods, our families, or our children.

Our small businesses and retail stores are also getting safer, with retail theft declining for the month, quarter, and year-to-date. Hate crimes also continued their decline as well.

All of these reductions in crime are no accident. They are the product of our administration's priority to take on crime and quality-of life issues. Even with the tremendous steps we've taken in making our city safer, we know that even one crime is still one too many.

And while these numbers show real progress, we will not rest until all New Yorkers are safe — at home, in our subways, and on our sidewalks. This administration will never tolerate a feeling of anything goes on our streets or in our neighborhoods. Because of our steadfast focus on public safety, the deep bench of leaders we've put in place at police headquarters, and the hard work of the brave men and women of the NYPD, New York City remains the safest big city in America, the best place to raise a family, and a place where you know that your city is looking out for you. Those who come after must make sure we don't go backwards and, instead, continue the progress we have made to make our city and streets safer. This city's in good shape. Let's keep it that way.

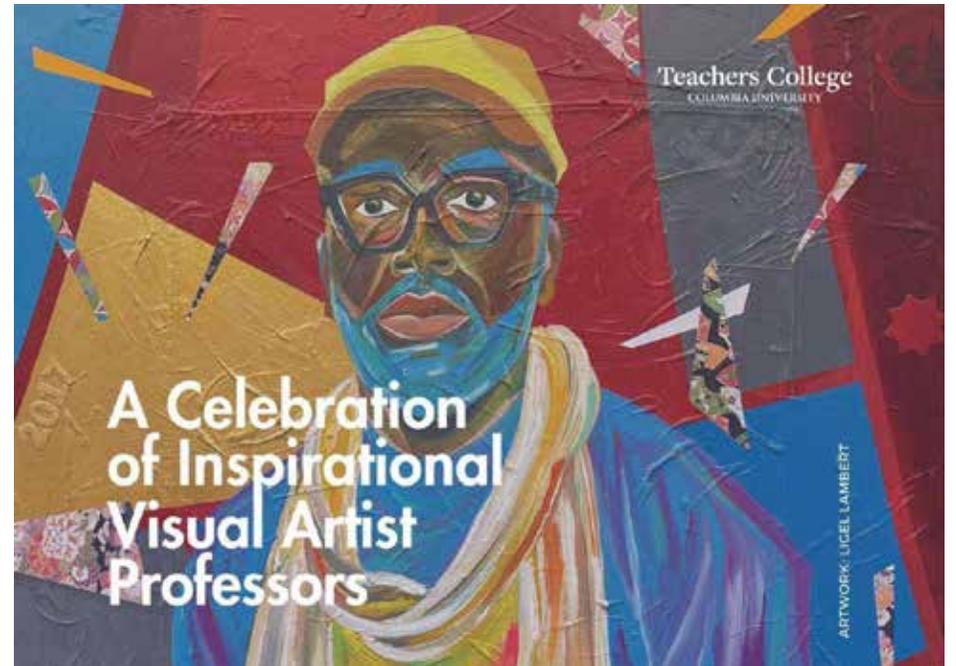

Figuroa, former lead singer for Tito Puente’s legendary orchestra, the show celebrates the rhythms, voices, and revolutionary spirit of Latin music royalty. The story is woven together by the Emmy-award winning poet and executive director of the Nuyorican Poets Cafe, Caridad De La Luz, “La Bruja,” under the direction of Waddys Jáquez. The cast includes Bobby Allende as Tito Puente; Michael Stuart as Tito Rodríguez; Yaharia (YaYa) Vargas as Graciela; Anissa Gathers as Celia Cruz; Grizel “La Chaci” Del Valle as La Lupe; and K7 as Machito.

Known as “The Home of the Mambo,” the Palladium Ballroom was America’s most important venue for the development of Latin music and dance throughout the 1950s. Mambo music and dance were co-created at the Palladium where Puerto Rican, Cuban, Dominican, Jewish, Italian, Irish, and African American patrons danced nightly to music of the “Big Three”—Tito Puente, Tito Rodríguez, and Machito. The Palladium was the most famous Latin nightclub of the era because of its location in midtown Manhattan where people from all economic and social backgrounds—working class, middle class, and high society—gathered to dance the

night away. In an era when divisions in society were prevalent, the Palladium offered unity on the dance floor. It was one of the few places where differences in race and class were set aside in the name of music and dance. From celebrities to dishwashers, everyone was welcome at the Palladium where patrons were judged based on their dancing ability rather than the color of their skin.



Celebrating Justice and Culture: 2025 NAN Triumph Awards

On October 6, 2025, the National Action Network (NAN), led by civil rights icon Rev. Al Sharpton, hosted its annual Triumph Awards at Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York City. The star-studded evening honored trailblazers who have used their platforms to champion justice, equity, and cultural transformation. With a backdrop of elegance and activism, the event brought together leaders from entertainment, media, and community advocacy to celebrate courage and commitment in the face of social challenges.

Kenneth “Babyface” Edmonds – The 13-time Grammy-winning singer, songwriter, and producer was recognized for his decades-long influence on music and his commitment to uplifting Black artistry. His work has shaped generations of R&B and pop, and his philanthropic efforts have supported youth and education initiatives.

Ari Melber – The Emmy-winning MSNBC host of *The Beat with Ari Melber* was honored for his incisive journalism and dedication to truth-telling in an era of political polarization. Melber’s coverage has consistently highlighted civil rights issues and held power to account.

Chelsea Maddox-Dorsey – As CEO of A Wonder Media Company, Maddox-Dorsey has been a force in diversifying media ownership and content. Her leadership has opened doors for underrepresented voices in broadcasting and digital storytelling.

Vincent Bohanan – Founder and director of the Sound of Victory Choir,

Bohanan was celebrated for his contributions to gospel music and his role in nurturing young talent through faith and community engagement.

The evening featured stirring performances that blended artistry with activism. Vincent Bohanan and the Sound of Victory Choir delivered a soul-lifting set that brought the audience to its feet. Babyface, in a rare live appearance, performed a medley of his greatest hits, reminding attendees of the emotional power of music to unite and heal. Additional musical guests and spoken word artists added depth and resonance to the ceremony, though full performance details were not publicly disclosed.

Rev. Al Sharpton opened the ceremony with a powerful address, emphasizing the urgency of defending civil rights in a time when voting rights, diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) initiatives are under attack. “The Triumph Awards has been an opportunity for NAN to recognize those who are brave enough to use their channels to fight for justice across the globe,” Sharpton said. “More than ever, we need to recognize those with the courage to speak up against the challenges

before America right now.”

Each honoree echoed this sentiment in their acceptance speeches. Ari Melber spoke about the role of media in preserving democracy and truth. The awards are more than a celebration—they are a call to action. This year’s ceremony followed Rev. Sharpton’s March on Wall Street, commemorating the 1963 March on Washing-



"107 Days" by Kamala Harris

Five minutes is all it takes to make a simple PB&J sandwich.

You can watch an episode of your favorite crime drama in an hour. In 24 hours' time, your heart will beat 100,000 times to pump roughly two thousand gallons of blood through your body. You can take a vacation in a week, set or release a new habit in three, learn a new task in a month, but in the new book "107 Days" by Kamala Harris, it takes real time to make history.

When she learned that she would ultimately be the Democratic nominee for the 2024 election, Vice President Kamala Harris was relaxing at home with her great-nieces and a jigsaw puzzle. The phone

rang; it was her "boss," Joe Biden, calling to tell her that he was halting the re-election race he'd been running for months, and was throwing his support to her.

And thus begins this open, sometimes controversial, straightforward political memoir.

In that pragmatic way you've come to expect from Harris, she says that she immediately made a few demands. She believed that timing and verbiage were key on any announcement that the Biden camp made, and she says she absolutely insisted that it be done right.

What she was about to embark upon wouldn't be easy. She understood that it would be "the short-saw campaign in modern

presidential history" in a country torn by political division almost immediately after the election that made her Vice President. Oh-so-carefully but adamantly, she insists that she was loyal to Biden throughout, though she knew acknowledges trouble spots if he was tired or overstressed.

And so, she and her staff instantly began planning. The choosing of her VP offers readers a fascinating look inside the road to today's White House (or, at least part of it) – and in this, Harris explains why she didn't make certain choices.

There's a lot of frustration inside this book – at Biden and his staff for occasional lack of support and recognition, at oppositional politics, at foreign governments, media, and at herself. The grievances are sometimes seething, allowing readers to conclude that the unsurprising stress of campaigning, non-stop travel, and sleepless nights while continuing to do Vice Presidential duties impacted Harris, as it would anyone. She says her "campaign was fresh, alive, vibrating with energy. It seemed like anything was possible," though her descriptions of the rigor of campaigning can suggest otherwise.

"This is not a genteel profession," she says. "You must be ready to brawl."


In light of that avowal, you may be surprised to know that there's not an overly-excessive amount of opposition-bashing here. Yes, there's some – but Harris mostly takes

Michelle Obama's "go high" stance.

Says Harris, "I do know that I tried."

Overall, throughout "107 Days," Harris shows little reticence in her stories: she is blunt, she pulls no punches, and she may leave a lot of peeved people behind. Still, if you voted Blue nearly a year ago, or if you're concerned about politics today, it's time for this book.

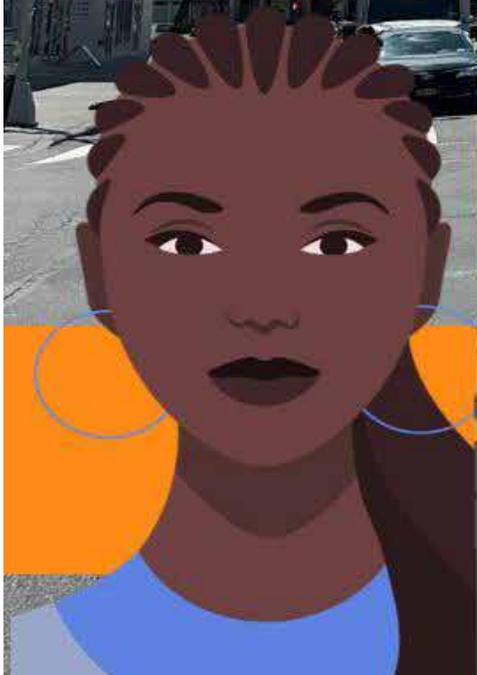
